He is working on summer communication, for June it will be end of year wrap up, July is Athletic Schedules and sign ups and August will be back to school information. Students ended the year with completing NWEA in Math in the 54th percentile and reading in the 51st percentile. Summer goals are to set up SWIS Behavioral school wide info system to better track and support student behaviors with implementation for the 26/27 school year. Upcoming goals for the school year are to incorporate student of the month for MS/HA with Big Ticket items for each grade level. Regarding athletics, one open coaching position is Varsity Volleyball. Open gym is currently being run by coaches. Fall sports schedule is ready and sign ups are done for fall sports. Per the sign ups, we have enough for a MS Volleyball team as well.
