I. CALL TO ORDER AT 6:02 P.M.

II. ACCEPTANCE/CHANGES OR ADDITIONS TO AGENDA: Remove Item B from New Business.

Originally the prediction was a deficit of \$269K, we're now looking at potentially under \$200K with a goal of reducing that to under \$100K. Matthew is looking at our low pay structure and wants to improve on that. More information will be presented to the board at the March meeting.

V. STAFF COMMENT: Matthew introduced Ms. Brook Stafford to the board. Ms. Stafford is our newest Elementary School staff member who is already making a huge impact on the students she works with.
